Community Heritage Ontario and the Kingston Heritage Committee invite you to a workshop on Thursday, February 15, 2007 to be held in the magnificent Kingston City Hall. The morning will be about the legal tools of preservation, heritage inventory and designation and how municipal heritage committees may work with property owners, the community and councils to preserve properties with cultural heritage value. In the afternoon, members of the Conservation Review Board (CRB) will talk about its role, their experience of conflict and the hearing process in the event that parties to a conflict are unable to resolve their differences.
